## FACTS ABOUT ACWORTH

Listed on the National register of Historic Places, the Collins Avenue Historic District offers a reminder of Acworth's history with restored Victorian-era homes and Craftsman-style bungalows.

Lake Allatoona was created in 1950 by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, to address the growing water needs in Atlanta. Shortly after that, a 1,500 foot dam was formed just southwest of the city, separating the 260 acre, man made Lake Acworth from Lake Allatoona, and with that the city brought in white sand and established Acworth Beach, a public beach and recreation area. Residents can be found relaxing on the beach and joining in celebrations often held on the lakefront.

## DOWNTOWN

Among the many popular areas of Acworth is its main street in the downtown district. Residents can often be found strolling through the eclectic shops and fine dining in one of the many restaurants, in addition to being host of several local events like Taste of Acworth.
